Cris Mayo's interests include philosophy of education, gender and sexuality studies, and multicultural theory. Her book manuscript details clashes over AIDS education and gay inclusive multicultural education in New York State in the 1980's and 1990's. She is currently working on an analysis of gay/straight alliances in public schools and their work in the formation of alliance identities. This work, together with projects that examine the relationship between Latino/a families and schools, and pre-service teachers' interaction with diverse children, are part of a larger project examining the role of civility and difference in forming educational communities.
